Fatou Keïta was born in Soubre, Ivory Coast. She was educated at the University of Abidjan, Ivory Coast, the Polytechnic of Central London and the University of Caen in France, and in the United States. Ms Keita is a Doctor of Lettres and teaches English

literature in the English department at the University of Cocody in Abidjan. As a Fulbright Scholar, in 1995, at the University of Virginia in Charlesville (U.Va), she conducted research to create a program within her department back home on Black women writers of the United States and Britain. In addition to independent research, Ms. Keita has audited a course on African-American Women Writers taught by Angela M. Davis, assistant dean of students and associate professor of English. She also worked with the Carter G.Woodson Institute of Afro-American Studies and with mentor Tejumola Olaniyan, assistant professor of English. She chose to study at U.Va. because it came highly recommended by University of Abidjan colleague Jane Toungara, formerly of U.Va. After the remarkable success of her children's book "Le petit garcon bleu" (The Little Blue Boy) in 1995, Ms. Keita graciously shared the credit with others. "I wrote the stories, but the books have been a collaborative effort," she said, explaining that her friend, Ms. Tahiri, also from the Ivory Coast, illustrated the books and another friend, Adrian Murphy of London, is translating them into English. Even her little son had a hand in the projects. "We colored the illustrations with crayons and markers," she said.
